

Credit accreditation application deadline: The Friday of 15th week of every semester at 5 pm. Credit transfer application deadline The Friday of 16th week of every semester at 5 pm. Notes:

Certification Regulation

(Area Courses): Center for General Education Regulations

- (1) Students may take courses that other departments offer and apply for recognition as General Education credits. [*\text{ *Students should first email the General Education Center contact person (Ms. Chen, z10604029@email.ncku.edu.tw) to request the syllabus URL of the course to confirm its designated study area.] Applications must be submitted online (Application for enrolling courses from other college/department as area courses for general education) by the student during the application period announced in the system within the course selection period of the semester, and must be approved by both the student's department and the General Education Center. Late applications will not be accepted. If students wish to withdraw an approved course application for recognition as General Education credit, they must complete the withdrawal through the system before it closes for that semester. Late withdrawal will not be processed.
- (2) Any course application that has been approved and for which the student earns a passing grade at the end of the semester shall be recognized as General Education credit.

★The department may recognize a maximum of 2 credits in the Natural and Engineering Sciences area.

★The department may recognize a maximum of 4 credits in the Life Sciences and Health area.

- (3) Courses in foreign languages other than English may be recognized as credits in the Humanities area, whether taken at this university or other institutions. However, international students may not have courses in the official language(s) of their nationality recognized as General Education credits.
 - * General education and elective courses with the same course title may only be selected once. Duplicate enrollment is not allowed and will not be counted towards graduation credits.
 - * The regulations of this university shall handle matters regarding general education course credit waivers and cross-institutional course selection.
